The Ballot Box stood at 0000 at the beginning and read 4,041 when the polls were closed at 8:00pm. Eastham’s election warden, Shawn Shea, declared the polls closed and the voter lists were verified.

Additional ballots not included in tabulator total: Twenty-six (26) ballots not processed in the tabulator on election night were hand-counted, forty-seven (47) overseas absentee ballots received by the Town Clerk’s office on or before November 3, 2020, one (1) provisional ballot approved plus two (2) ballots postmarked on November 3rd and received in the mail on or before November 5th. These ballots were added to the total count, as required by state election laws, bringing the total number of votes cast to 4,117.


Due to the COVID pandemic, fourteen (14) days of early in-person voting were State mandated, to include two Saturdays and Sundays.

Three thousand three hundred ninety-nine (3,399) early voter and ninety-two (92) absentee ballots were requested by mail with a return of three thousand two hundred ninety-eight (3,298) early and eighty-eight (88) absentee ballots. If a voter requested a ballot via mail and did not return it, an additional option to vote in-person was then available. Six hundred fifty-five voters (655) voted in-person with social distancing and proper personal protection provided to voters and election workers.

This vote represented 89.34 percent of registered voters.

There were 4,608 voters registered for this election.
